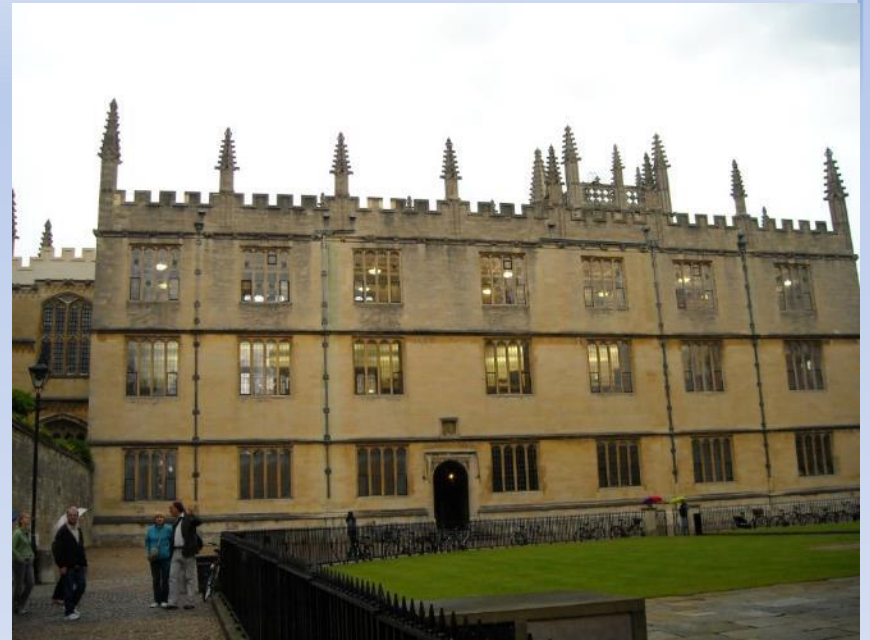


Eclectic buildings in Oxford represent different styles, which could be admired during excursions and walks in free time.

From the hill of Old Sarum you could see Salisbury Cathedral.

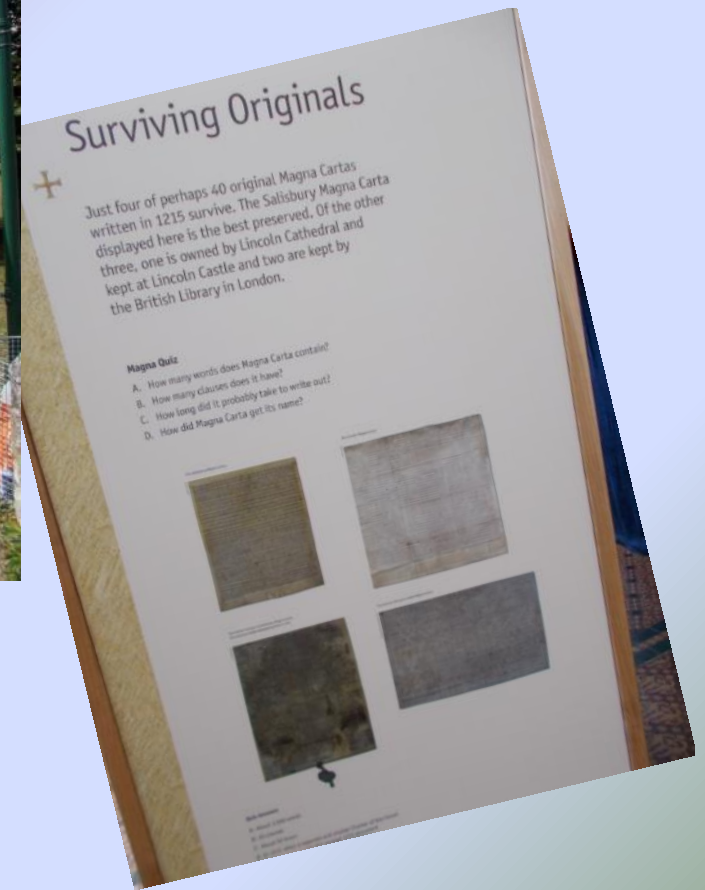


Ruins of Old Sarum are as fascinating as Stonehenge. Some people claim that even more.
